☐ LPIB Grade 9 Application

- 1. All students must complete the LPIB Application Form
- 2. Attach it (either as a filled pdf, if possible, or a scan of a hard copy) to an email as per instructions on the application.

☐ Grade 8 Teacher Referral

-Give the confidential Teacher Referral form to your grade 8 teacher and have him/her fill it out as per the instructions on the form, and then she/he should email it back to KSS. *Please allow your teacher sufficient time to complete this form. You are responsible for communicating accurate dates to your chosen teacher.*

-a copy of the pdf is available on the IB area of the KSS website.

☐ A copy of the most recent Grade 8 report card

-Progress Reports are acceptable; please note that this copy will not be returned.

For students outside of the regular KSS catchment area:

- 1. Students are not eligible for transportation when they enter the IB/PreIB programme
- 2. Courtesy transportation MAY be available through the special circumstance application process
- 3. Students who are eligible for transportation are given priority on the busses and special circumstance riders may lose their seat at any time during the year
- 4. Tri-board will endeavor to arrange rides as soon as they are able but special circumstance applications may not be processed until mid to end of September.

Note: All LDSB students receive City of Kingston bus passes.
