

7. Student Rep Update

Adrita Karr is our Student Rep for this year. She was unable to attend the first meeting. She will be at the meeting on 21 October.

8. Teacher Representative Update

- Rob Switzer is the Teacher Rep for KSS.
- KSS is bursting with students this year.
- What do parent's want to hear about at meetings? **Ie.** For involvement with your students, as them to login to minds online
- Rob talked about the importance of being involved in your student's education
- A recruiting fair will happen soon for 2027 Vietnam trip
- Greece trip for IB students meeting at 5:30 p.m. on 08 October in the library

9. Principal's Report

KSS built 1300 timetables; large classroom sizes.

Discussion pursued re large classroom sizes.

- Anja Wilke asked about 'open borders'. Why is KSS bursting with students this year? Open borders
 allow students from outside of the catchment area to attend KSS, if they have their own
 transportation. Parents are allowed to enrol their student up to March in the school year.
- What are the solutions for September 2026? What is the explanation for moving kids online and possibly into portables? Why are courses collapsing? Darren Seymour explained using the example that in June a class size may be 20 kids and then by September, with students changing their minds regarding a class, that class size may change to 8 students, so the course collapses. If there is a course that is highly sought after, it may require some students taking the course online.
- The school only has so many classrooms, so there is the possibility of portables for KSS. The number of portables is not known currently. KSS cannot have portables without permissions from the Board and it must go through the City of Kingston. It has not gone through the city yet.
- What is the current enrolment? KSS 1170 and last year was 1048.
- Parents voiced concerns over online courses and portables; what can we do? This topic will be
 added to the agenda to discuss at the next meeting. Some parents would like to write a letter to Jim
 Neil, Trustee, voicing their concerns. If this letter does come to fruition, it has to be written realizing
 funding not from KSS and with careful wording.
- Current classroom sizes? It depends on the course. Ie. Culinary/Shop classes at 20, some Math courses at 36.
- Mona Rahman noted that we need to reach out to families beyond School Council to get their
 opinions on the concerns. Others noted that if they wanted their voices heard, they should be at the
 council meeting. Stephanie Van Der Pryt voiced that not all families can attend council meetings
 and should not be left out of important topics for that reason. Everyone has the right to be at
 meetings and/or contact council for any concerns/ questions. We represent all families.
- Five (5) different bands this year run by Ms. Kelli Caravan.
- Club Carousel happened on 18 September. Club Carousel is a morning when Grade 9/10 rotate

through different stations or activities to work on a variety of tasks.

• Will the S'more newsletter continue? No, not currently.
