8. Principal's Report:

It's been a busy month at KSS/Vanier with students participating in a variety of sports. LINK Leaders continue to be active in the school and a variety of field trips taking place. Vanier students are taking part in STEM activities through Girls Inc to raise participation in the STEM pathways for our female students. Vanier Band and Instrumental music programs are also up and running.

Orange Shirt Day was 30 September, recognizing the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. October 1st was our first run, walk, roll event, inviting all of our feeder schools to promote connection between our schools. A fantastic day was had by everyone.

Universities and Colleges have begun their annual visits. We are also hosting help sessions for students as they begin to work through their post secondary applications. On 11 October, Vanier and KSS teachers came together for a PD of learning, looking at our school data and to making plans for our professional

learning strategies for the upcoming year. Again this year we plan to work together to boost every facet of student life.

Darren discussed the results of the OSSLT (Literacy results) for Grade 10 and what it meant for students, teachers and how to further support student's learning.

Anja brought up University vs Trades. Darren explained that it is important to support our students, whether they plan to attend university, college, trade schools or join the workplace immediately following high school. All options are pathways for a better future. Our school fairs include Universities, Colleges and Trades booths.

Sarah, who had been on Zoom, came to the meeting in person. Although we had chatted with other parents on Zoom, we did not hear Sarah asking questions or her comments. She had some concerns with getting information about activities, events and educational support/opportunities. It was recommended to reach out to our guidance counselors and teachers, who are always there to support our students and their families. She also brought up, 'My BluePrint (MBP).' We'd had an earlier discussion on having another session for parents and students on the usefulness of MBP. Unfortunately, there are only so many licenses, so parents must go in into MBP through their student's portal. Sarah believed there was a way to gain access for parents.
